In partnership with local, state, and federal agencies, these have been installed at several public fishing piers in Itasca County. The governing bodies of these locations have generously agreed to provide the personnel to monitor the units and empty them as needed. You'll find receptacles in Grand Rapids at Crystal Lake, Forest Lake, Grand Rapids Area Library riverfront and Sylvan Bay; in Cohasset at the Mississippi River and Tioga Beach; at Trout Lake in Coleraine; at Winnie, Pokegama, and Mud Lake dams; at Coon Lake and Lake of the Isles in Scenic State Park.

Itasca Waters is a local non-profit organization of volunteers, dedicated to preserving the health of area lakes and rivers.
