

Nine Native Plant Species to Consider Planting Along Shoreland

Below is a list of nine arranged in order of priority.

- \Rightarrow Prairie cordgrass (Spartina pectinata)
- \Rightarrow Fox sedge (Carex vulpinoidea)
- \Rightarrow Boneset (Eupatorium perfoliatum)
- \Rightarrow Swamp milkweed (Asclepias incarnata)
- \Rightarrow Golden alexander (Zizia aurea)
- \Rightarrow Blue vervain (Verbena hastata)
- \Rightarrow Blue flag iris (Iris versicolor)
- \Rightarrow Giant bur-reed (Sparganium eurycarpum)
- \Rightarrow Joe pye-weed (Eutrochium maculatum)

When thinking about planting any of the above or other native plant species, please consider the importance of starting with a reputable source for seeds or plants.

Below are a few options to consider:

- \Rightarrow Purchase seed from a reputable company (e.g., Morning Sky Greenery, Bloomers, or Prairie Restoration) and grow them out.
- \Rightarrow Purchase plants from a reputable company and grow them out, then divide them.
- ⇒ Obtain permission to collect seed from a local source and grow those out (this one can be risky because it places the burden on you, the collector, to know exactly what plants you are gathering seeds from.
